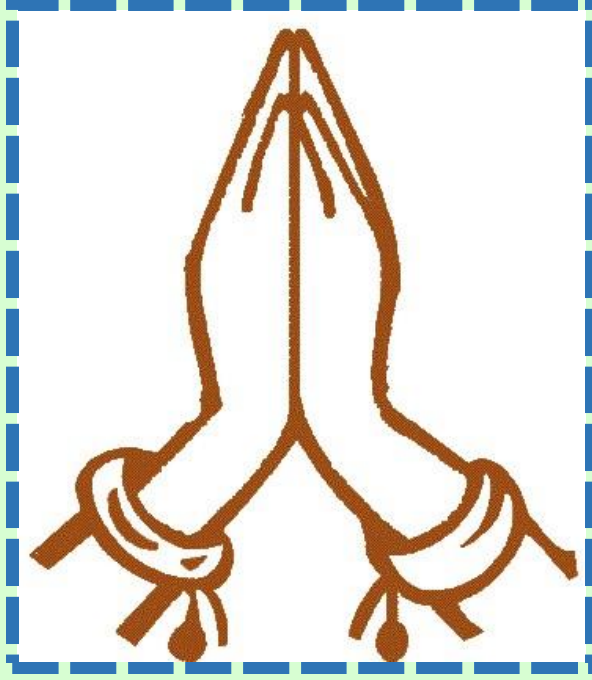

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The College offers at present 18 undergraduate degree courses, 7 post graduate degree and 5 certificate courses through semester system. The medium of instruction is English. University Examinations for the odd semester will be held in November and for the even semester the exam will be held in April every year. Every semester contains a minimum duration of 15 weeks, each with 6 working days, totaling ninety working days or 450 hours of teaching. A Six Day Order system is followed.

TEACHING AND EVALUATION

In addition to the number of tests specified by the university, two internal tests are conducted in between the semester as per the university pattern. Progress reports on the academic performance and general behaviour of the students are sent to the parents regularly, model examination is conducted at the end of each semester. Spoken English, Hindi classes, Yoga, Games and Other Extracurricular activities are part of a weekly schedule.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

1. Each Student is allotted a Tutor to give counseling in studies, Examination and Career development.

2. Students must submit their leave letter to their respective Tutor, who scrutinizes and forwards it to the Head of the Department.

3. Students are being monitored by the Tutor with regard to their studies and other educational activities.

4. Tutor shall know about the personal background of each student allotted to them for better understanding and proper counseling.

5. Tutor will report to the Head of the Department, Principal and Parents regarding the student's discipline, performance and progress.

6. Tutor will guide the students in filling Applications, issuing Identity Card, preparing Progress Report, Attendance Report etc.

7. Students must note that the principal will issue any certificate or testimonial to the students only in consultation with the Tutor.

LABORATORY

This college has six fully air-conditioned computer laboratories with latest 400 TFT, LCD monitors and systems with latest configuration.

Well-equipped laboratories have been provided separately to Chemistry and Physics Departments.

The college extends internet facility to students at a free of cost. Student can access the net from 2.45pm to 4.30pm in internet lab.

THE LIBRARY

The library has a collection of more than 15000 volume of books, 20 Journals and 1500 project report from various courses.

Students, teaching and non-teaching staff and members of management can use the Library. Silence should be strictly observed in the Library. Students must keep their belongings in



the Counter allotted for that purpose and they should not bring any of their belongings inside the library. Students are advised to use the library to the maximum extent in their academic pursuit.

There are vast numbers of books are available in our library on various subjects like Tamil, English, Commerce, Management, Computer Science & Technology, Software Technology, Mathematics, Hotel and Tourism Management and Catering Science in addition to reference books like Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, General Knowledge Books and also books for competitive Examinations. Various Journals and Magazines and News papers are also available.

LANGUAGE LAB

To improve the communicative skills of the students an English Language Lab is established and functioning effectively.

ISSUE OF BOOKS

1) Each student will be provided with one borrowers' ticket. They can use the ticket to borrow books from the library. Any book issued to the student is for a period of 15 days only from the date of issue. If they want the book for more than the validity period, they can renew the issue, if there is no any other claim for the same book. These tickets should be returned when they leave the course.

2) Students are responsible for all books borrowed on their tickets. They should use the book carefully and return them safely. If any book or ticket is lost, it should be reported to the Librarian immediately.

3) If the ticket alone is lost, the student shall pay a fine of Rs.25/- (Rupees Twenty-five only) and get new ticket. If the borrowed book is lost, it can be replaced by purchasing a new book of the same author and edition and a fine of Rs.25/- will be collected for carelessness and if it is out of print, it may be replaced by a Xerox copy and a fine amount of the actual cost of the book will be collected.

4) At the time of borrowing and returning the books, only the concerned student must handle the book.

5) On receiving a book, the student must examine and report to the librarian if any damage or markings are found in it. Failure to do so will lead to the payment of fine.

6) Books must be handled with utmost care. Defaulters will be penalized.

7) Books borrowed must be brought to the library at the time of renewal.

8) Books will be issued to students for the semester holidays. But books will not be issued to the outgoing students after the last working day of the academic year.

9) All the students after the completion of the course and the students who discontinue their studies should surrender their library tickets and should obtain a clearance certificate from the librarian.

10) Borrower's tickets are not transferable at any circumstances.
